UNSEEN: How We're Failing Parent Caregivers & Why It Matters

A documentary that opens up an important discussion about the challenges facing many parent caregivers and what we can all do to help. Unseen follows Jess and Ryan Ronne, a blended family with 8 children, including Lucas, who has profound disabilities requiring total care. Their situation has gotten more and more challenging as Lucas gets older and stronger. With limited resources and support, caregiving takes a toll on their physical and mental health. Following the screening a panel of community members, parents and DDA will be hosting a facilitated discussion and a question and answer session.


