April is Autism Acceptance Month

Autism acceptance means embracing and valuing autistic people as autistic people instead of being afraid of us, having low expectations, or trying to find a way to make us not autistic. The Americans With Disabilities Act says "disability is a natural part of the human experience." Autism is a natural part of the human experience, and autistic people are members of our community, citizens, friends, family members, and fellow humans. Accepting autistic people is about honoring human diversity and making sure that everyone is included, valued, and contributing in our society.

1 in 45 people are autistic. You probably know an autistic person. Autism acceptance means—you want us around. At its heart, autism acceptance is about accepting autistic people, instead of being afraid of us, having low expectations, or trying to find a way to make us not autistic.

Acceptance is not passive tolerance. Acceptance is an action. Does acceptance mean no therapies, no education, no intervention, just letting my kid stay where they are forever? Isn't acceptance passive? No! Acceptance is not passive. Acceptance is an action. Acceptance means doing everything you can so that your autistic child will grow up into the best autistic adult they can be.



Is your child "consistently inconsistent", or do they struggle with many, or all, of the following:

- understanding consequences
- emotional regulation and/or behavior challenges
- ADD/ADHD
- · fine or gross motor delays
- · sensory processing sensitivities
- · language delay or related challenges
- memory and/or processing speed difficulties
- math comprehension i.e. money, time, large quantities





Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders are the number one cause of Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (IDDs) nationwide and worldwide, and are more common than Autism, Down Syndrome, Cerebral Palsy, and Tourette's combined.

Community is important, as are people who "get it," and who understand. FASD Focus NW support groups are a chance to build community, make connections and share ideas. To know that you are not alone. Each group meeting is spent sharing joys as well as tears, asking questions, and offering and receiving support from others. This is a volunteer ran and peer-led support group that is open to families or caregivers to individuals who have been diagnosed with or are suspected of being impacted by Prenatal Substance Exposure (PSE) and/or Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders (FASDs) as well as to adults impacted by PSE/FASDs. Our groups are respectful of and open to birth mothers. In 2008, the CDC reported that more than half of all pregnancies (51%) were unplanned. At FASD Focus NW, we seek to educate and reduce stigma related to unintentional alcohol consumption and pregnancy.

Our support group is always the 4th Wednesday of each month from 8-9pm. There is no fee to attend and you do not need to sign up each month.

SPECIAL EDUCATION LEGAL CLINIC

Northwest Justice Project is introducing a free special education legal clinic to provide advice about your child's rights to an education.

Attorneys from the Northwest Justice Project will meet with you by phone to discuss topics related to your child's IEP or 504 plan, including: qualifying for services, access to the services you need, discipline of students with an IEP or 504 plan, failure to provide interpreters or translations, and discrimination.


